Subject: Notice of Back to Normal Low Water Conditions

---

On January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023 the Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority downgraded from a Level 2 to a Level 1 Low Water Condition for the watersheds within the CLOCA jurisdiction. This was a result of improving rainfall and stream conditions. Conditions have continued to improve throughout January, and consequently, **CLOCA is lifting the Level 1 Low Water Condition and declaring Normal Conditions for the watershed.**

CLOCA's hydrologic monitoring program looks at streamflow and precipitation within the watershed over 30- and 90-day periods to determine low water status. During the month of January, our watershed received slightly over 80% of the normal precipitation for this time of year. Wet conditions and rainfall are expected to continue for the foreseeable future according to recent weather forecasts.

The Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority will continue to monitor rainfall and streamflow conditions to determine the appropriate Water Condition as necessary.
